Schools Work

I was recently asked to help plan an Easter worship service for a primary school. The school children will be telling the story of Easter using the gospels, in their local church. Whilst this isn't local to us here in Lowestoft, it is so good that school children are participating in the journey of the cross around the country. Let us pray for the Easter events happening between schools and their community churches.

Youth Groups

MOTB has continued to meet in the church building on a Thursday evening. During the half time talks we have been able to show videos of footballers, such as Bukayo Saka, talking about their faith. We have also had a session talking about the Bible, teaching that the Bible is God's word written by many authors, over many years, separated into many different books and that all tell the narrative of God's love through some very epic stories. We introduced the young people to the idea of reading the bible on their phones and suggested following online faith communities and pages that share a passion for football such as Ballers In God. Our last week of term is focussed on Easter, where we shall share Jesus' journey on the cross and enjoy some Easter treats together.

We still don't know where we are with booking a pitch locally. Please pray for this as we try to navigate and plan for the term ahead.

PULSE continues to be very popular, with lots of friends joining. We love welcoming the youth into a safe space, where they can have fun and build friendships. We have had a challenge night and made chocolate Easter nests. Our last week of term will be focussed on Easter, where we shall show a video explaining the journey Jesus took from Palm Sunday, through Good Friday and on to Easter Sunday. There will be easter treats and a Glow in the Dark Egg Hunt.

You may have noticed that there are a few more young people joining us on a Sunday morning which we give great thanks for. **Please do come over and say hello to them.**

CREW has had engaging conversations around prayer and being a Christian in school. We have enjoyed breakfast together, and spent time being creative with Easter crafts.

Thank you to all youth group helpers for every way in which you have served the young people this term.

On a Sunday morning, we need more adults to help, to lead sessions and to have discussions with the youth in the setting. This will allow us to continue offering the age-targeted group on most Sundays.

Chaplaincy Collective Update

We are continuing to deliver breakfast pastries to our friends in retail alternate Mondays and Fridays, and we love to see how our encouragements and prophetic messages on the napkins we give are connecting with people.

Recently we gave a prophetic word to a lady, and it resonated so powerfully with her, she cried, we prayed, it was a beautiful thing! Please pray for God to change lives through what we do.

On the Fridays, in the cafes, we are supporting people we come into contact with listening, praying, and signposting.

Last week Esther went to Parent & Tots for the day and set up a listening and hand-massage space. The parents really engaged with it and we were able to listen and support them, chat about Jesus, and pray. Please pray people are awakened to Jesus through this partnership. Chaplains will be attending again regularly.

Weekly Prayer Focus: 24th March 2024

Braintree Baptist Church

Located in north Essex approximately a twentyminute drive from Stanstead Airport, is the town of Braintree. These days, it is perhaps better known for the Braintree Village (formerly Freeport) Shopping Centre than it is for its historic links to the wool and silk trade.

Braintree Baptist Church is in a central location in the town. Rev Ayi Samson Ake has been the Minister of the fellowship for one year having moved from the West Midlands. Samson is supported by an excellent team of Deacons. The fellowship is very active in their local community. A Bounce Café runs on the first Saturday of every month and selected school holidays. Using the large hall to house a bouncy castle and café seating, it aims to provide a suitable and safe provision for young families in the town centre. If Bouncy Castles and inflatables are not your thing, you could try the Crafty Café which runs every Monday morning throughout the year providing a warm space and friendly welcome. Both Cafés have given Samson an opportunity to develop his links with the community and provided some ministry opportunities too. Around the Christmas period, the Church were excited to celebrate a service of baptism. Braintree Baptist Church is a growing and vibrant fellowship who give thanks and glory to God for all that is happening in their midst.

To continue building for the future, Braintree Baptist Church is undertaking a renovation project. Replacing boilers that have reached the end of their life and updating toilet facilities present some interesting challenges.
