The little children love it when they come in but more so when they leave and put their lights and sirens on, it makes their day. The police will also be coming in to most of the groups and chatting about security, social media and anti social behaviour to name but a few.

We also launched our 40 days of giving on 14th February, which will be continuing throughout lent, we have had a very supportive start to this scheme and we know that this will continue. So if you are able to donate any items, either food or toiletries etc, we will be extremely grateful. We will put together what has been donated at Easter and will give out to those in need.

We also have FISH, this is always so well attended not just with us but at other venues throughout the town. Please continue to pray for those that lead the team and for those at the different venues as they provide meals to many families throughout the town in the school holidays.

Schools Work

February was a month to focus on the schools in our local community. As a team we managed to donate donuts to staff at 13 schools along

with a prayer card. Please pray for the conversations we were able to have with staff, and for God to open doors where He wants us to have a presence within these schools. Thank you for the kind donations towards the cost of this.

Additionally, a few of us gathered (in the pouring rain) to prayer walk around some of the schools closest to the church building.

And finally, we focussed prayer on schools during the prayer encounter evening, where we offered an insight into the local community schools and were able to see some of the struggles that children and young people face.





Youth Groups

MOTB has been meeting in the church building on a Thursday since the start of the

year. At the start we didn't really know if the young people would come to the church building, but it has been so good to have (on average) 20 young people joining us. We have been able to get to know a few more of the 'players' a bit better through conversations and continue to have great chats with the 'spectators.' It has been so good to see how the group has felt comfortable in the space, have explored the rooms, sat in the sanctuary, and joined in with different games. And I am grateful to have been in the dry and warm. We do hope to return to the outdoor space as soon as we are able to.

PULSE has had a good start to the year, with lots of friends being invited. This term we have welcomed two youth practitioners from the Youth Justice hub who have facilitated conversations with the youth around safety in the community. We have introduced lent, eaten pancakes, given out bibles and welcomed Jesus in conversations.

For the term ahead, we have a trip planned to Laser Tag and lots of Easter fun activities.

Prayer Prompts:

- We are waiting for a date to return to EPA football pitch, hopefully it will be soon.
- For more helpers to join the youth ministry team (see note below)
- For all who help with youth ministry within LRBC.
- Please pray for the 95% of children and young people who do not go to church.
- Please pray that LRBC youth groups remain as safe spaces where young people can hang out, build relationships, explore faith and have fun.



The CREW, PULSE and MOTB teams need more helpers to allow these groups to run as they currently are.

We have had to introduce a waiting list for Friday night PULSE, as the group has grown to a size that cannot allow any more young people to currently join us. On a Sunday morning, we need more adults to help, to lead sessions and to have discussions with the youth in the setting. This will allow us to continue offering the age-targeted group on most Sundays.

From the 3rd of March the older children will have their own children's table in Church and will now come into Church for the first two songs and offering. Kidz Church are making a commitment by all using a cross bookmark to add stickers for coming to church, being kind, helping others etc. all the way up to Easter and then they will be presented with a devotion book or Bible and certificate.

The children enjoyed our half term prayer space on the 18th of February with pancakes and the older ones really engaged in the activities in the hall. All the children took home pancake mixes, prayers, and a 40 days of Lent pack to use as a family.

At Kidz Church I welcomed in a new friend called Prayer Bear who children can hold if settling in or feel sad, they can also take him home for the week and pray with him. There was no Kidz Church on the 25^{th of} February but colouring and activities were left out for the service.

In March we are celebrating Mother's Day and the lead up to Easter with an Easter Party on the 24th of March.



Little Fishes Parent and Toddlers

Little Fishes have enjoyed using the musical instruments at song time this half term and had the bible story Jonah and the whale with crafts as well as making valentines' cards We gave out a treat for our parents for valentines and Lent to give them 5 minutes of Self-care with 'Love yourself through Lent' over the half term holidays.

Weekly Prayer Focus: Gunton Baptist Church
Gunton is a suburb of Lowestoff in Suffolk where G

Gunton is a suburb of Lowestoft in Suffolk where Gunton Baptist Church is situated on a large estate in a deprived area. The church has a small and mainly elderly membership and has been without a minister since 2022.

There is a leadership team of four deacons. Sunday services are led by one of the deacons, several of the members preach or local lay preachers or sometimes videos are used. The church has a very busy programme of weekly activities that reach out into the wider community. These include:

- Create 'n' Craft with coffee and craft activities.
- A very popular Hub café with drink and food served at a low cost. It provides a great opportunity to meet others and build friendships locally.
- A weekly prayer and Bible study meeting.
- The Roots Community Clothing Scheme which is like a charity shop and provides clean, good quality clothing and household items for the local community. Any money raised provides equipment for homeless people and those who are moving in to new accommodation.
- A small foodbank to support the needs in the local community.
- And Baby Basics which works with midwives, health visitors and other professionals to provide Moses baskets, baby clothes bundles, cots, prams, pushchairs and high chairs to vulnerable mums in and around Lowestoft.

The church has a very practical focus in its outlook and ministry that tries to help those in need in the local area. Their greatest prayer is for families and children to become part of the church.

Please pray:

- For new people to join the church and make things grow.
- For guidance and leading in what God wants the church to do in the future.
- For fresh ideas and how the church can look for new opportunities.



Pakistan number 7 on the worlds watch list. Last year's devastating attack on the Christian community in Jaranwala was a sobering reminder of the hostile environment that Pakistani believers live in. This violence drew the world's attention, but Christians also face less obvious persecution every day. Rehena says –

"We are a lower class, because we are Christians". At the factory, Rehena has to keep her faith quiet. "it is dangerous to discuss my faith in Jesus" she says. "we have to hide our identity. We cannot even say the name of Christ. "If I must choose between Jesus and a better life, the choice is not difficult. Jesus is the only way, this is what I cling to."

Please Pray With Rehena. Heavenly Father, please watch over 600,000 Christian women in Pakistan who, like Rehena, work under conditions in factories. Keep their eyes fixed on you, and show them your loving kindness. Protect and encourage all your children in Pakistan. Amen.
